Essentials

Stay Safe

Keep yourself safe in the Centre by listening to your coach or a member of staff, behaving responsibly and speaking out when something isn't right.

Arrive Prepared

Always bring the correct kit and plenty of water for the on-court breaks.

Stay Seen

When you are at the Centre, stay in places where we can see you and don't wander off.

Behaviour

No Bullying

Report any incidents of bullying, including homophobia and transphobia to a member of staff.

Have Fun

Make our centre a welcoming and friendly environment. Play tennis by the rules and have fun.

Show Respect

Respect all our staff and coaches.

Celebrate Differences

Respect and celebrate difference in our Centre and do not discriminate anyone else on the grounds of gender, race, sexual orientation or ability.

Essentials

Make sure your child has the appropriate kit for the lesson, as well as enough food and drink.

Please make sure your child arrives on time for the lesson and is picked up promptly, or let us know if you're running late or if your child is going home with someone else.

Keep all contact information updated at Reception

Maintain a good relationship with the staff and coaches at the Centre

Talk to us if you have any concerns - we welcome any feedback from you.

Always encourage good sportsmanship.

Use social media responsibly when talking and sharing about what goes on at the Centre. Behave the same way online as you would in person.

- Use constructive training methods to develop abilities across all coaching sessions
- Respect your position of trust and maintain appropriate boundaries and relationships with young people

- Respect children's trust and well-being whilst being honest with them
- Lead by example when it comes to good behaviour, sportsmanship and commitment to the Centre
- Develop positive relationships with parents
- Always make sure our Centre is a warm and friendly environment
- Stop play if an injury occurs and ensure the correct treatment is applied
